Toronto Emerging Athletes Mentorship (TEAM) Fund - Year Four

The TEAM Fund continues to provide funding to more emerging athletes. Twenty one athletes received funding in 2017. This is an increase in athlete grants from seventeen athletes in 2016, eleven athletes in 2015 and six athletes in its inaugural 2014 year. The TEAM Fund is a legacy of the 2012 Ontario Summer Games which was co-hosted by the City of Toronto and Toronto Sports Council. A key objective for the TSC's involvement in the planning of the Games was to 'build the base' for the future. The ongoing challenge for the TEAM fund will be securing additional funds and promoting the availability of the grants to more athletes in more sports.
