T2018 Toronto Emerging Athletes Mentorship (TEAM) Fund Athletes

The TEAM Fund continues to provide funding to more emerging athletes. 24 athletes have received funding in 2018. This is an increase in athlete grants from 21 athletes in 2017, 17 athletes in 2016, 11 athletes in 2015 and 6 athletes in its inaugural 2014 year. The TEAM Fund is a legacy of the 2012 Ontario Summer Games which was co-hosted by the City of Toronto and Toronto Sports Council. A key objective for the TSC's involvement in the planning of the Games was to 'build the base' for the future. The ongoing challenge for the TEAM Fund will be securing additional funds and promoting the availability of the grants to more athletes in more sports. Registration fees from the 2018 Toronto Sport Summit will be used to support the 2019 TEAM Fund athletes.
